

Fishing Days

Friday 28th and Saturday 29th October 2022

Start time/Fishing times

Friday 28th 6:30am start and back to base by 5:00pm.

Saturday 29th 6:00am back to base by 4:00pm.

All boats entered in the competition must depart from the Whitianga Harbour and return to the Whitianga Harbour.

There will be an optional shotgun start at 6.30am on Friday morning for those interested in taking part (weather permitting)

Venue

At the rear of the Mercury Bay Game Fishing Club, 12 Esplanade, Whitianga.

Registration/Entry Fee

All entries must be registered by the 1st September 2022. All entries to be made via our website www.extremeboats.co.nz. \$90.00 per person, this includes dinner at the prize giving on Saturday night and a tee shirt. To confirm and secure your entry placement

You will receive a confirmation email to confirm your entry and payment is received in full.

Briefing

Briefing will be held in the shed at the rear of the Mercury Bay Game Fishing Club at 7:00pm Thursday 27th October 2022. On arrival you will be able to collect your skippers pack. This will contain your tournament tee shirt, which you will be required to wear on Saturday night to be eligible for your meal.

Parking

If you will be parking at the Mercury Bay Wharf you will require a launch/ parking permit. These can be purchased at the Stunned Mullet Bait And Tackle for \$30.00 per day. They will be open 5.30am - 5.00pm during the Tournament with a late night closing 6.30pm Thursday 27th October (night of briefing) WE STRONGLY RECOMMEND GETTING YOUR LAUNCH/ PARKING PERMITS SORTED THE DAY BEFORE THE TOURNAMENT TO ELIMINATE ANY CONGESTION THE DAYS OF THE TOURNAMENT. The Stunned Mullet have offered a 10% discount on bait, tackle and ice for those fishing the Tournament and are situated at 71A Cook Drive Whitianga. A QR code will also be supplied in the skippers packs at briefing which will enable launch/ trailer park permits to be purchased on line. When purchased on line the passes are valid for 24 hours from the time they are paid for.

For safety reasons it is the responsibility of all skippers to ensure that their vessels have two means of communication.

Fishing Area

The northern boundary is off the tip if the Coromandel Peninsular. The southern boundary is out from the Whangamata harbour entrance. You can fish as far east as you are prepared to go.

These boundaries exclude Cuvier Islands.

Species

There are four eligible species:

- -Kingfish
- -Snapper
- -Trevally
- -Kahawai

MPI minimum sizes and bag limits (limits) apply. A maximum of ONE entry per species per angler per day is permitted.

Fishing Methods/Eligibility

All eligible fish must be caught on rod and reel or a handline with no more than three hooks attached. Fish cannot be caught in a net, on a longline or speared. All fishing must be from a manufactured Extreme Boat only.

Measuring your catch

Place your fish on the Official Extreme Boats 2022 measuring mat with the correct day card displayed. Take one or more digital photographs that clearly shows the whole fish, placed side on, on the measure with either the upper or lower jaw touching the edge of the L shaped plastic end of the measure. Ensure the V of the tail is clearly visible and as close to the middle of the measure as possible, take the photo from directly above the fish looking down on it rather than from the front or side. It is critical for your entry and your responsibility to ensure you provide an image that we can use to validate your entry. Please note that your fish may not be eligible for entry to the Extreme Boats Tournament if the above conditions are not met, however the organisers reserve the right to accept an entry on the basis that an appropriate reduction in length is made for any non-compliance and/or the Extreme Boats administrators reserve the right to disqualify your catch.



How is length determined?

All fish with a V in the tail the inner most point of the V must touch or exceed the line on the measure to qualify for that 0.5cm increment. For example if your fish is just over 40cm but does not reach the 40.5cm mark then the length recorded will be 40. cm.

How to Enter your catch

(where your nominated password is unchanged)

Your password or PIN will also be unchanged. If you're unsure of your password, just enter your e-mail address in the Forgotten Password/ First-Time User section.

2. Log-in with your e-mail address and password

First-time users

(if you have not previously registered for an Extreme Fishing comp)

- 2a. Enter your e-mail address in the Forgotten Password/First-Time User section and a four digit PIN will be sent to your e-mail address. Check your junk-mail folder if it doesn't arrive promptly.
- 2b. Log-in with your e-mail address and PIN. You can update the PIN in the My Account section as required.
- 3. You should now be logged in.

 User tip (I-Phones can remember your e-mail address and log-in with face ID making it a quick and easy process)
- 4. Select the **Enter catch** option.
- 5. Fill in the appropriate catch record fields.
- 6. Attach your photo and click the **Next step** button.

Once your catch has been approved by the Extreme Boats administration team you will receive an e-mail to confirm the entry of your catch. If you do not have a connection while you're on the water, wireless internet will be available at the Lusty & Blundell caravan located at the Whitianga Wharf. The caravan will be open at 2.30pm each day if you require any assistance with entering your catch. All catches must be submitted or be in the queue at the caravan by 5.00pm Friday 28th October and 4.00pm Saturday 29th October.

Day 2 cards will be issued at Friday night prize giving or an official in a crew shirt will have them at the boat ramp in the morning.

Prize Giving

Prizing giving Day 1 will be held behind the Mercury Bay Game Fishing Club Friday 28th at 7pm along with spot prizes. Prize giving Day 2 and over all prize giving will be held behind the Mercury Bay Game Fishing Club Saturday 29th at 7:30pm along with spot prizes. Please ensure you are wearing your Extreme Boats Tournament tee shirt on Saturday to be eligible for dinner. Dinner will be served from 6:15pm sharp.

Disputes

The tournament committee will investigate any disputes. Any disputes must be received in writing within 30 minutes of close-off on the day in question. The tournament committee's decision shall be final and binding.

Safety Rules

- 1. It shall be the responsibility of the skipper or a nominated crew member to advise his/her other team members of the information given at briefing.
- 2. In the event of bad weather the tournament committee reserves the right to make one or more of the following decisions:
- Postpone the start on any day
- Cancel fishing on any day
- Restrict the fishing area on any day
- In the event of an emergency on the water, participants are to notify the Mercury Bay coastguard on VHF channel 63
- 4. All boats must carry the correct size life jackets for all passengers
- 5. All participants agree and accept to enter this competition at their own risk
- 6. That boating and fishing involves a risk.
- 7. Tournament organisers, officials, sponsors, Mercury Bay Game Fishing Club or any other person involved with the tournament are not to be held liable for any loss, damage or injury to a person or equipment incurred during the tournament.
- 8. Notwithstanding any representations made, it shall be the responsibility of all participants to ensure that the provisions of all statutes, ordinances, regulations and by-laws related to
 - (but not limited to) boating and fishing are complied with.
- 9. All participants agree to have read and understood the competition rules.



Skippers Responsibility

- 1. I have the necessary skill, knowledge and qualifications to safeguard all passengers on board.
- 2. My Extreme Boat and all equipment is properly maintained.
- 3. My Extreme Boat carries all the necessary safety equipment.
- 4. Have a minimum of two means of communication; i.eMarine VHF radio, cell phone, flares.
- 5. Each passenger has a correctly fitted life jacket.
- 6. All passengers are briefed on the location and use of all safety equipment.
- 7. My Extreme Boat is loaded within its limit and all equipment is securely stowed.
- 8. Trip reports and emergencies MUST be through Coastquard Channel 63.
- 9. If you will be parking at the Mercury Bay wharf you will require a launch/ parking permit which can be obtained at the Stunned Mullet or online via a QR code issued at briefing for \$30.00 per day.





2022 FISHING BOUNDARIES

Unless notified all vessels are to depart and return to the Whitianga Wharf each day. Fishing area is between the northern tip of the Coromandel peninsula and the southern side of the Whangamata harbour entrance. All vessels must return to Port each day in order to collect their day pass for the following day.
